The principal aim of the Public Interest Incorporated Association National Congress of Parents & Teachers Association (PTA) of Japan is education. We favor no specific political parties or religions. Through PTA activities in elementary and junior high schools, we aim to enrich social and home education in Japan while deepening partnerships between homes, schools and communities, and promoting the welfare and healthy development of children and students. In so doing, we aim to contribute to social development. (Mission Statement, and Paragraph 3, Articles of Incorporation)

Fundamental viewpoints

Independent initiatives toward educational reform

To promote healthy physical and mental growth in children, we will independently engage in educational reform to respond to social changes, and together with PTA members throughout Japan, we will look for the best way for the PTA to respond to the demands of a new era and fulfill our responsibility as a social education related group. As the national PTA organization, we will clearly state the significance of the PTA's existence, draw up revitalization strategies, including organizational management practices, and work to spread them and raise awareness.

Improving educational skills in the home

Reaffirming that the home is the starting point for the education of children, we will raise our awareness as parents and guardians, fulfill our responsibilities and grow along with our children. In addition, we will aim to improve our educational skills in the home while deepening our understanding of the school and the community.

Strongly asserting the importance of life and human rights

We will take seriously the various problems surrounding our children and work to stop bullying and abuse. At the same time, we will deepen our awareness of poverty and strongly assert the preciousness of life and the importance of human rights.

Also, we adults will learn and serve as models with regard to internet literacy and morals.

The healthy development of children

While fostering in children a spirit of protecting and feeling affection for their social and natural environments, we will aim to deepen their understanding of international society and raise citizens who wish for world peace.

Safety and security for children

We will aim to create a better living environment, one in which society as a whole can watch over the safety and security of our children.

In particular, we will promote a consciousness of disaster risk reduction and increase our contributions toward a crime-free environment.

Partnerships and cooperation

We will encourage wide-ranging, strong partnerships with homes, schools and communities while building more intricate partnerships and cooperating with the relevant government ministries and agencies.

Projects

The PTA of Japan carries out the following projects to achieve its goals.

National convention project

To contribute to improving the qualities of social education, home ducation and PTA activities, we hold a national convention.

We also support the block-level PTA research meetings held in the nine blocks throughout Japan.

Investigative research projects

To promote the welfare and healthy development of children, we carry out investigative research concerning the social environment surrounding children as well as investigative research including attitude surveys of parents on educational reform, and we widely disseminate the results.

Awards projects

To improve the qualities of and reinvigorate PTA activities, we give PTA awards to PTAs and other groups and individuals who make outstanding achievements in line with our association's objectives. We also give awards to selected outstanding newsletters.

Also, to improve home education skills and promote the importance of family ties, we hold a Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology backed contest in which we solicit three line poems with the theme "Let's talk at home! Our family rules, family ties and the importance of life." We then give awards for the best poems.

Public relations projects

To help improve the qualities of social education, home education and PTA activities, we provide information on issues facing the PTA while publicizing the circumstances surrounding projects such as the national convention and various activities.

International exchange and training projects

To train the next generation of personnel who can be active in the international community, we hold exchange events and training for children.

Educational assistance and grant projects

To support the healthy mental and physical growth of children who have been affected by disasters, we carry out education-related assistance activities.

Cooperative projects

We recommend excellent projects, goods, movies, etc. with recognized educational value.

Making requests of related organizations

To cope with current issues, we request cooperation from and make requests of appropriate related government departments and agencies.

Partnerships and cooperation with related organizations

To achieve the objectives of the PTA of Japan, we will form partnerships and cooperate with related organizations on projects and activities.




